

Program Timeframe

Resident Support Roles

Academic Advisor



Provide guidance and information on academic matters, i.e. learning plans/objectives, assist with understanding evaluation feedback, and support the academic side of Residency.

May be working at the same clinic as the Resident.

Preceptor



Responsible for supervision, observation, and evaluation.

May be working at the same clinic as the Resident.

Colleague Connections Mentor



Assist the Resident in the community, i.e. provide resources, suggestions and opportunities. Can help to create a safe space to discuss topics without fear of impact on their work as a Resident Physician. Caution - sometimes the mentor relationship can lead to friendship and long-term connections in the medical community!

We suggest that Residents match with a Mentor who does not work at the same clinic (aiming to provide a sense of separation from work & provide an opportunity to network outside the clinic placement).
